Master's Projects in the College of Human Sciences and Humanities



Submit project to dean's office for approval

Visit with faculty advisor the semester before you begin a project to determine whether a project is an appropriate capstone for you

Complete the master's course option form and submit to your project committee chair

Complete a project proposal and secure signatures of committee member(s)*

Enroll in project research hours*

Meet with UHCL library staff for project review check

Revise as requested by all on committee until all have approved

Complete project under direction of chair and with feedback from committee member(s)

Upon approval, submit project to the UHCL library for electronic archiving and publication



CHARACTERISTICS OF A PROJECT

A master's project demonstrates the acquisition of program-specific knowledge and fluency in program-related skills as defined in the student's master's project proposal

A master's project may, if the program requires, include the presentation of original work whether in the form of findings, analysis, or creative material

A master's project is evaluated by members of the committee as described in the HSH policy on master's theses and projects and by the college's associate dean and dean.

^{*}Note that some programs reverse the order of these steps. See your instructor of record for clarification.
