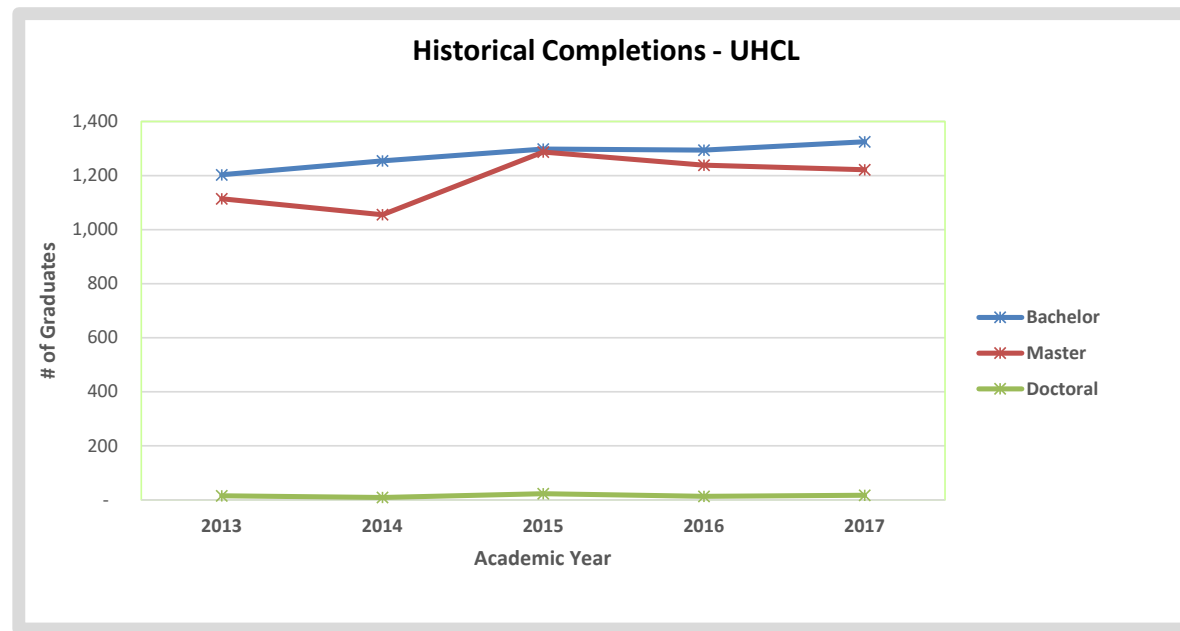

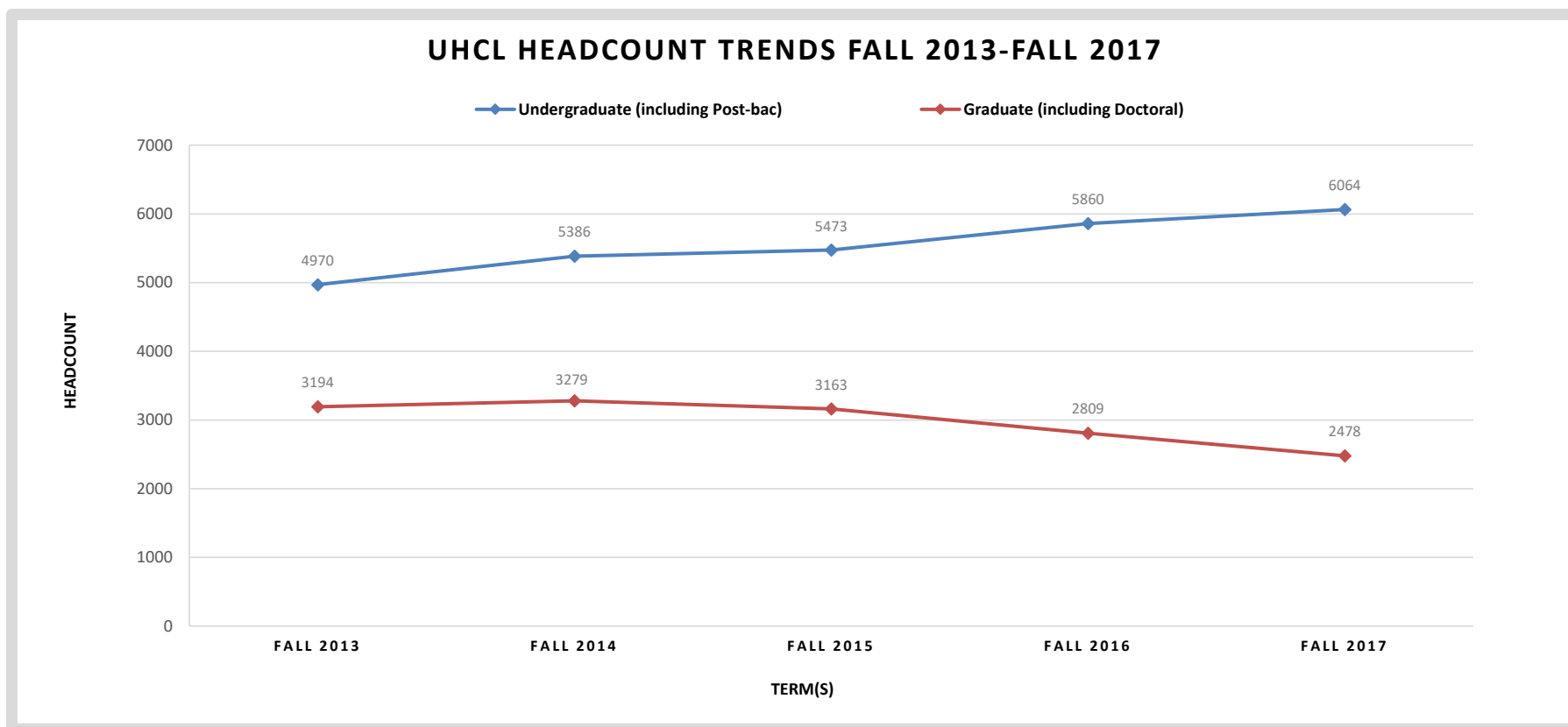

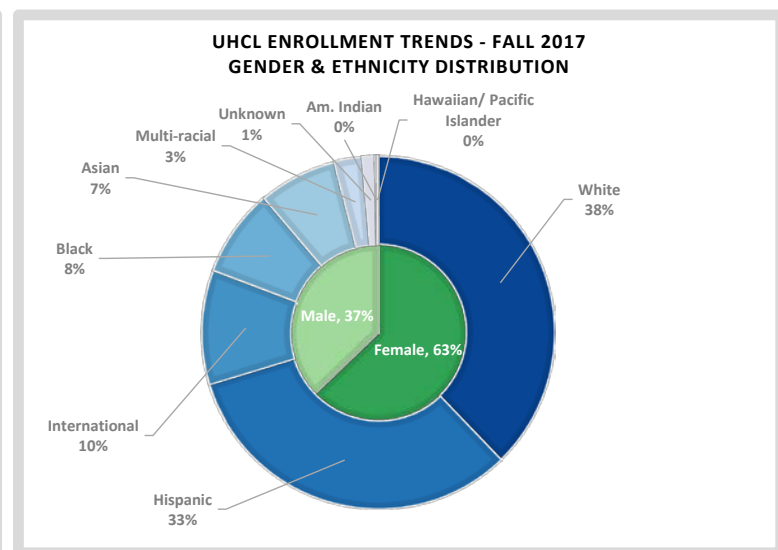

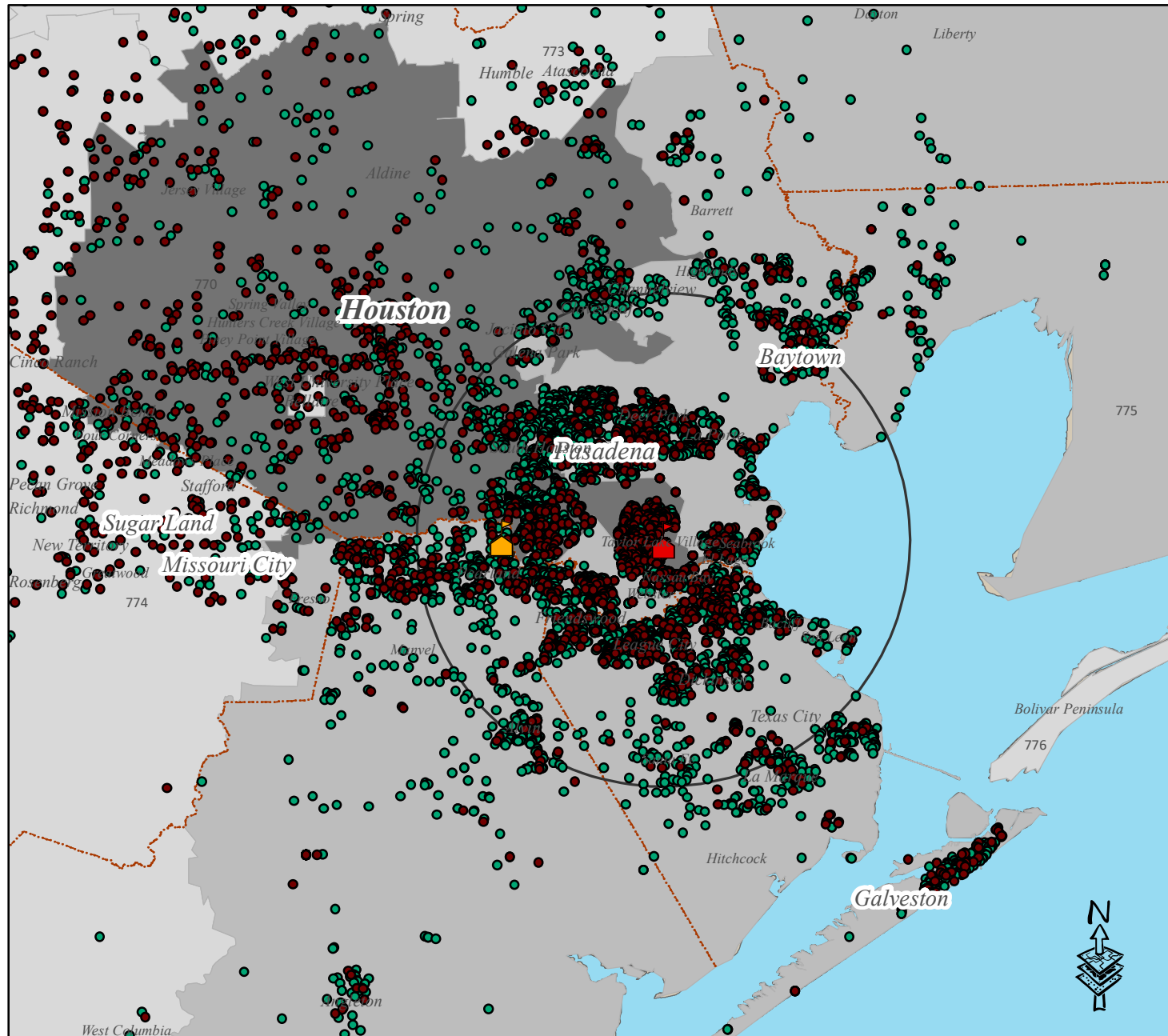

Within 15-mile Radius of UHCL, Fall 2017









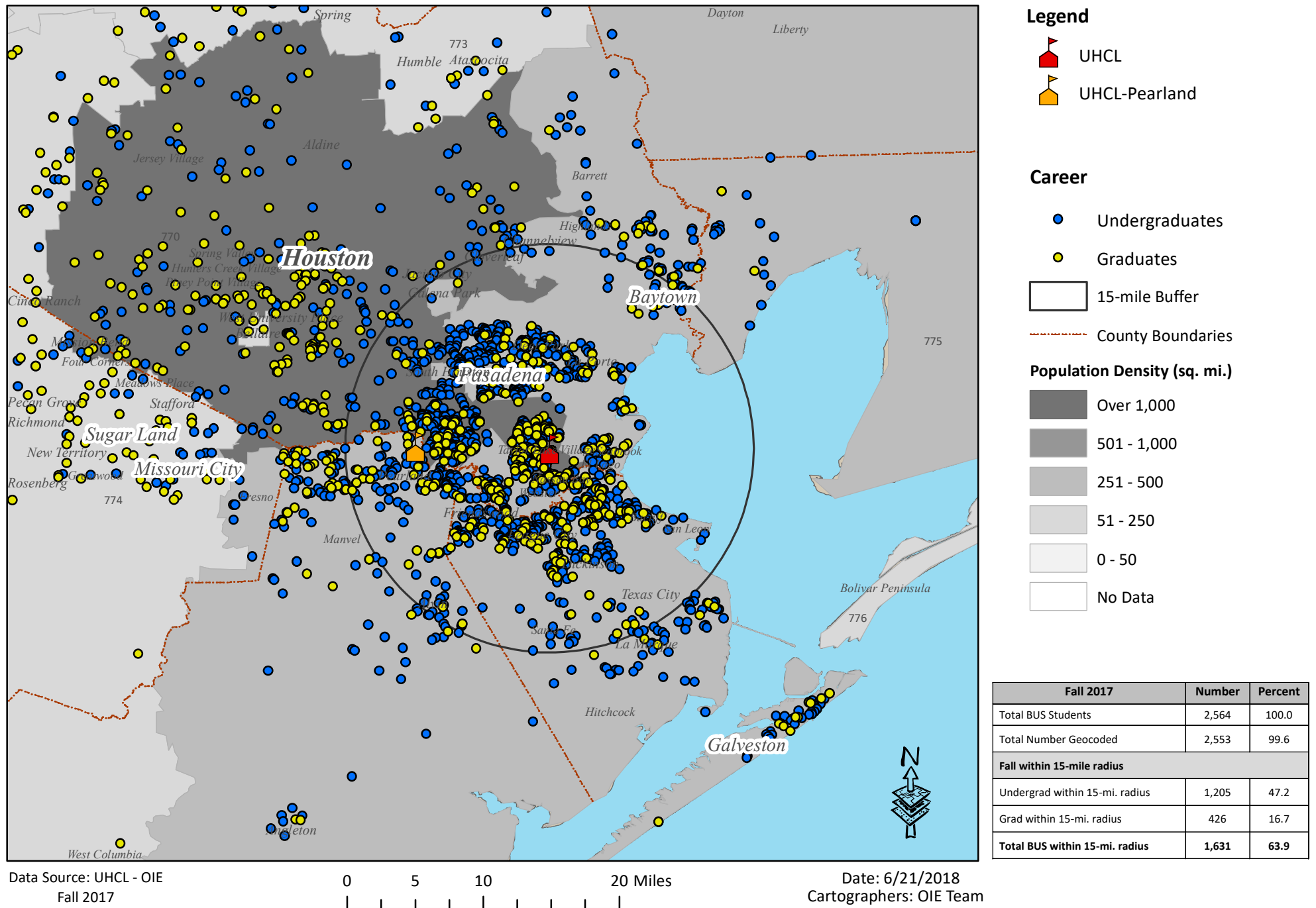

College of Business - Student Level Distribution by Residence

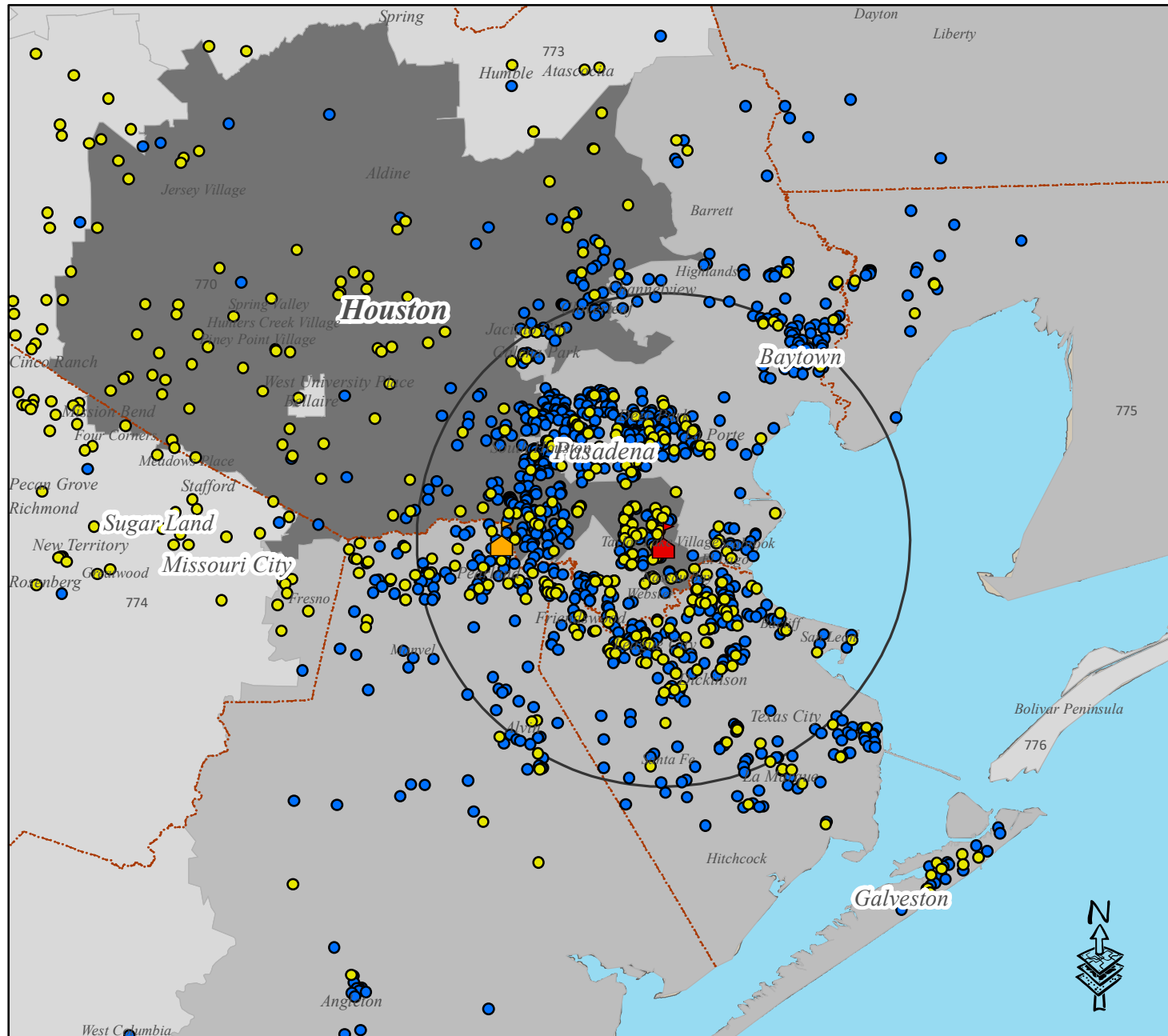

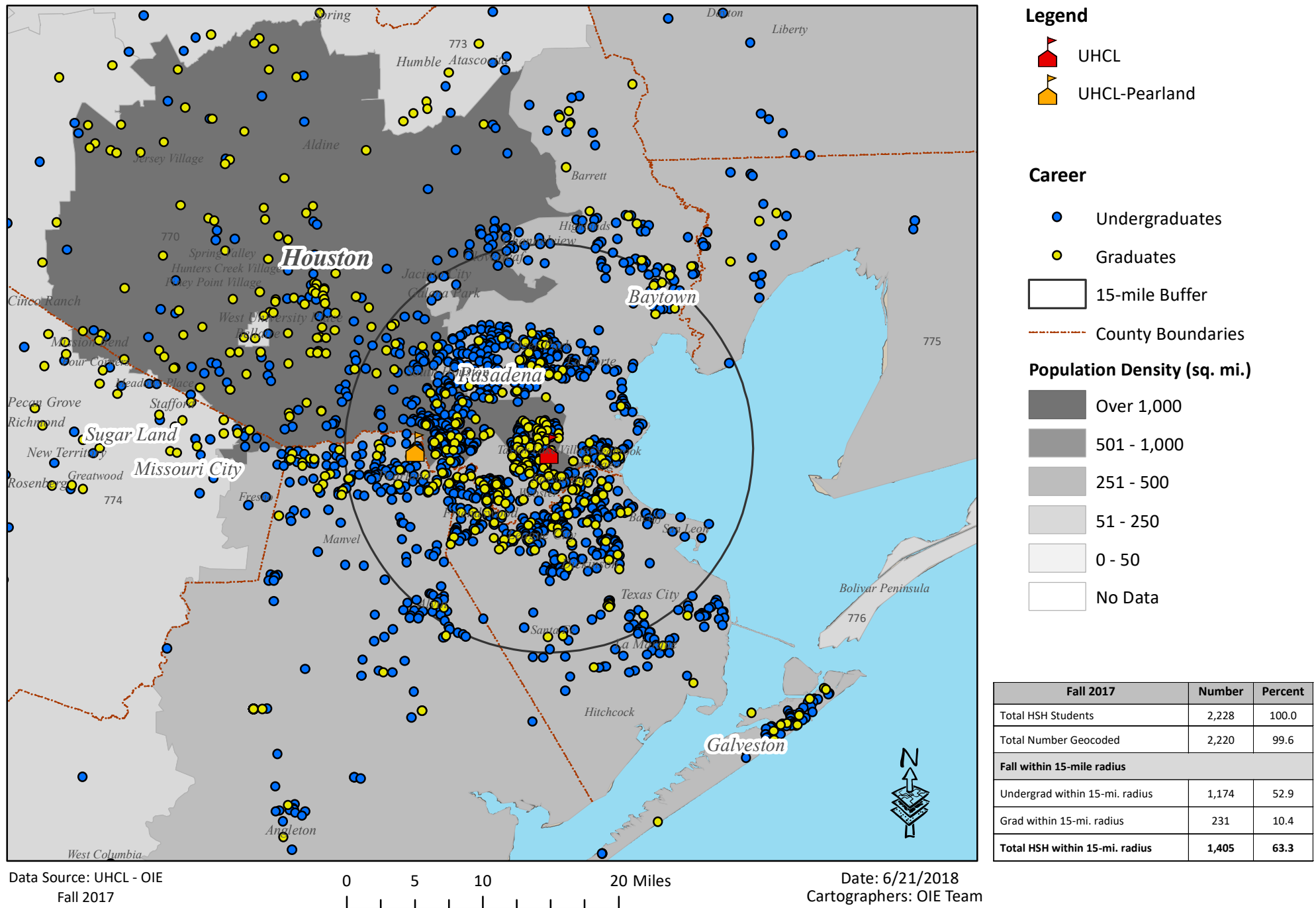

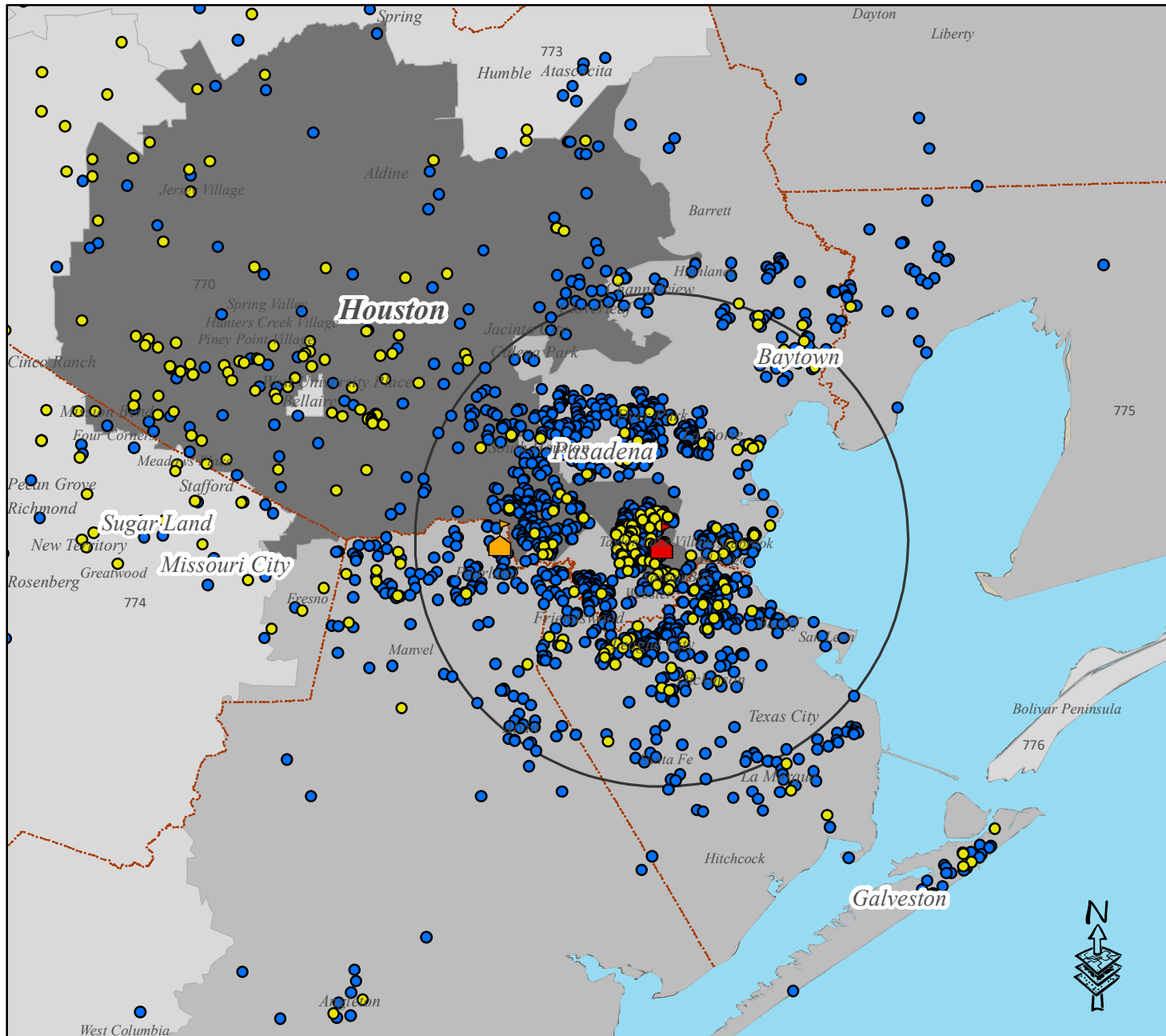
College of Human Sciences and Humanities - Student Level Distribution by Residence

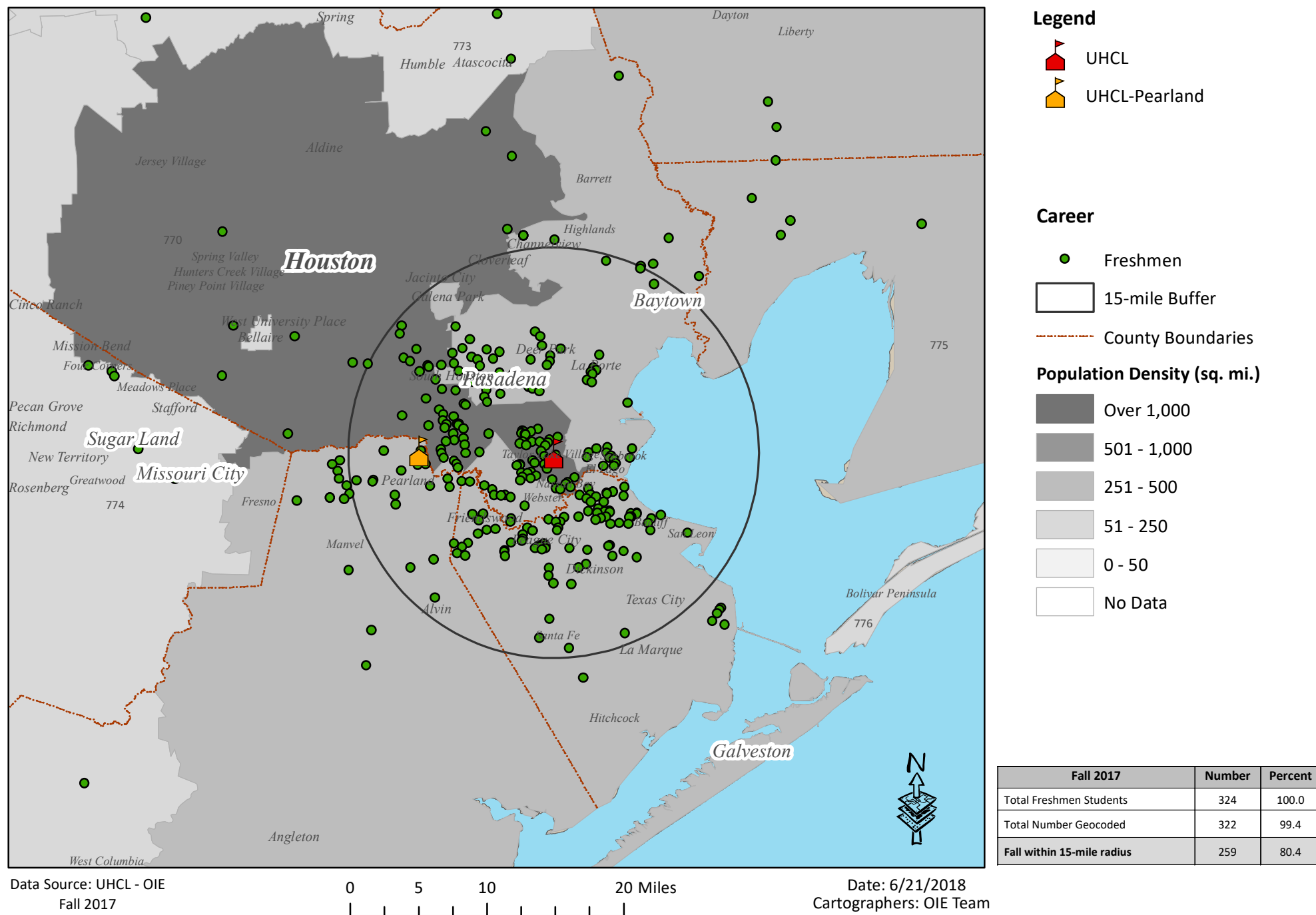

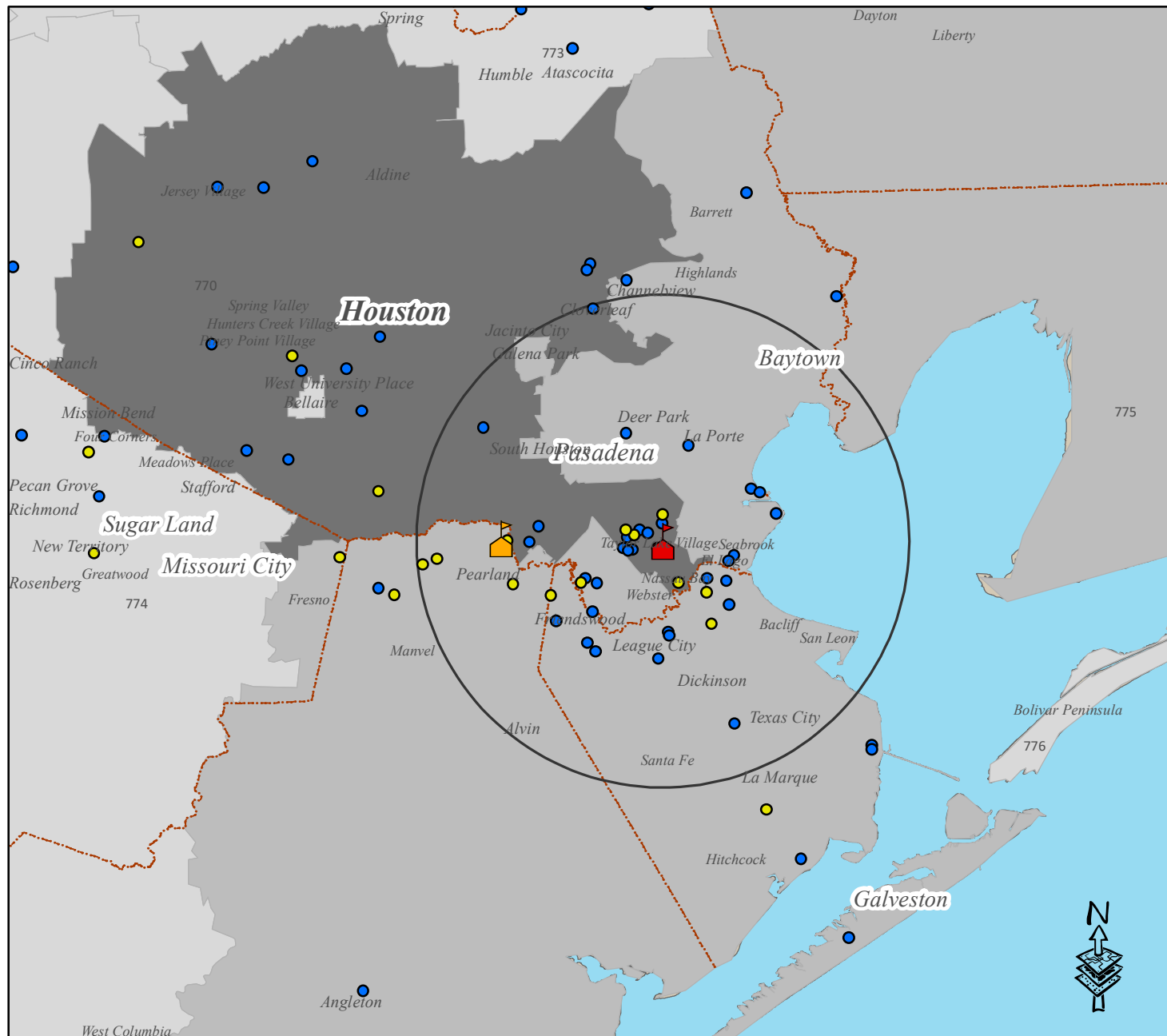
Freshmen/First-Time in College - Student Level Distribution by Residence

2. Sum the salary amounts for all funds (Items #14A-X), excluding the overload (Item #14Z) and flex-entry (Item #16) salary items.
3. Divide the total percent of time assigned for all appointments (step 1) into the sum of all salary amounts (step 2), giving a full-time equivalent (FTE) salary for all appointments. Double this amount to yield a nine-month FTE salary amount.
4. Summarize the FTE salaries (results of step 3) of ONLY the faculty who have percents of time assigned to appointments 01 and/or 02.
5. Tally all faculty with appointment codes 01 and/or 02 where FTE salaries are greater than zero.
6. Divide the total faculty with appointment codes 01 and/or 02 (results of step 5) into the total FTE salaries of faculty with 01 and/or 02 appointments (results of step 4) to yield the average nine-month FTE salaries.

Community College Advisory Council

When UHCL was established in 1971, the legislation provided for a statutorily created council of community and junior college presidents to advise the university president. This is the only such statutorily created advisory council in the state of Texas.

The statute provides for the Community College Advisory Council to consist of presidents/chancellors of each tax-supported community and junior college in Harris, Galveston, Fort Bend, Waller, Montgomery, Liberty, Chambers, and Brazoria counties. At the university's initiative, a bill was introduced and passed into law during the 1991, legislative session to add Wharton to the list of counties.

The legislation calls for the advisory council to "periodically study the overall needs of the region ... for the development of programs and resources in higher education, and as a result of its studies shall make recommendations to the board of regents of the University of Houston [System] regarding the development of the departments and degree programs of the [University of Houston-Clear Lake]. The board of regents shall give careful consideration to the recommendations of the advisory council."

The interaction of UHCL with its community and junior college partners is widely acknowledged as a state and national model of institutional cooperation and has been instrumental in the success of the university.

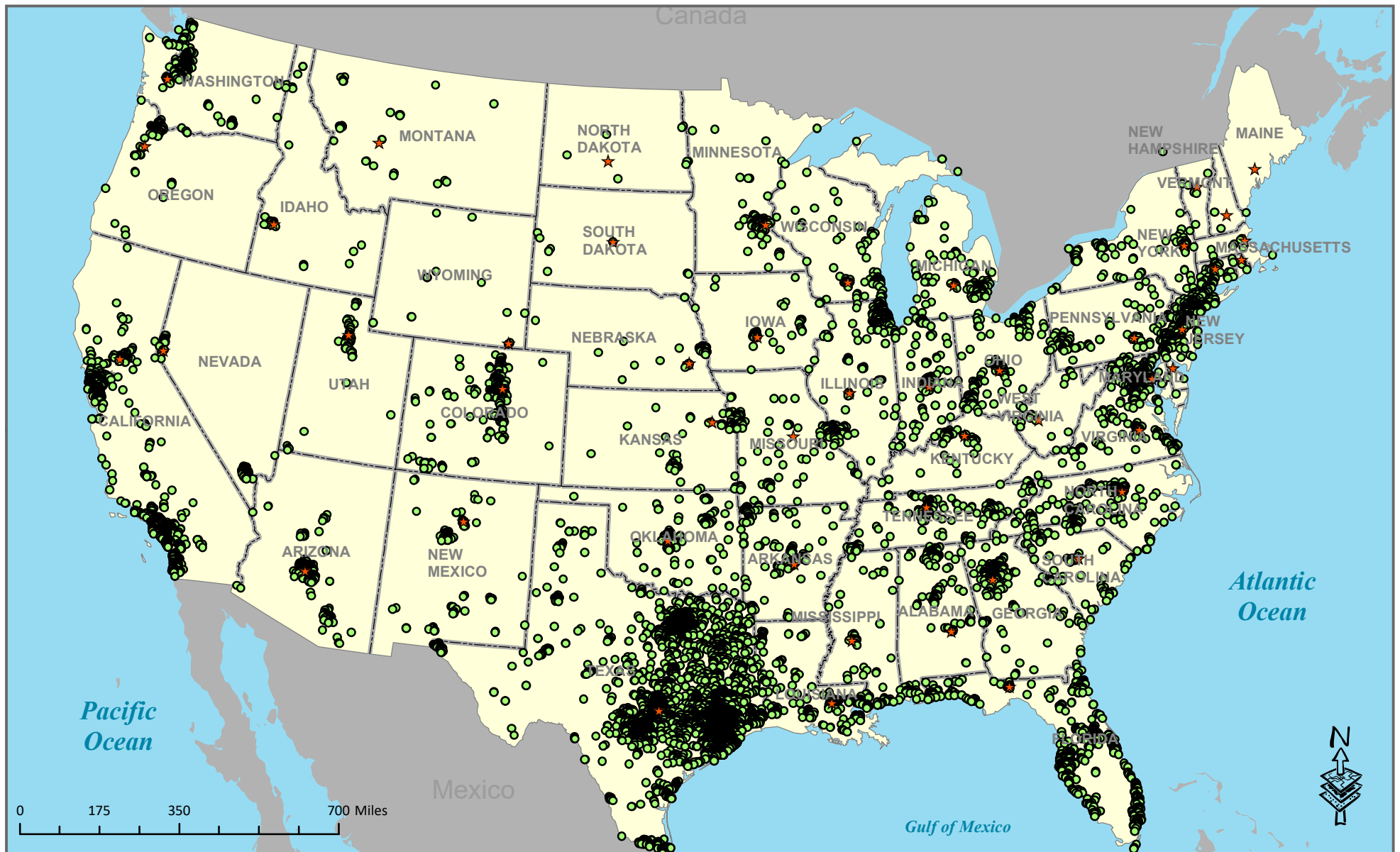
