University of Houston-Clear Lake Office of Institutional Effectiveness Alumni Relations Survey Summer 2017 Summary

In fall 2015, the offices of Institutional Effectiveness, Alumni Relations, and Career Services formed a committee to revise the old Alumni Survey into a more useful tool to meet the data needs. The new Alumni Relations Survey was built to capture the alumni experience at the University of Houston-Clear Lake (UHCL) three years after graduation and to determine the way their higher education helped establish their professional careers. The online Alumni Relations Survey was conducted in the summer semester of 2017 using Qualtrics survey software and iModules; it was launched in June 14 and ended on August 31, 2017. All alumni with current email addresses in iModules who graduated three years ago were invited to participate in the survey. The alumni data can be divided by school, by degree level, by gender, by ethnicity, by program or any of the above combinations. The average completion time for the survey was 10 minutes.




Which industry best describes your place of employment? (Choose all that apply)

Good atmosphere great educators

I feel completely satisfied with my education and experience received from UHCL.

Perhaps this is because I went to undergraduate school a while ago, but I felt unprepared when it was time to do my thesis. I think there needs to be a seminar or class on how to write a master's thesis. I had a less-than-stellar experience with my thesis advisor because, in retrospect, I really didn't know what I was doing/how to write it and he helped very little with that aspect. Now that I teach an AP research class, I see what I did wrong and I know I would be able to have a far less stressful time. Also, I attempted to change my thesis advisor multiple times, and was not allowed to - despite the frustrations I had. My second reader was aware of the frustrations and said that my experience was not entirely typical. I was hearing two different things from my advisor and second reader, making my experience extremely stressful and confusing.

UHCL did a good job of instilling a high quality of personal development but this personal development is not linked to successful employment. For instance, in my area of study (sociology) we should be taught to be professionals in informatics (statistics and database work) or should be guided towards a pathway in GRS. Most any position you can gain in sociology you should have a technical component. The faculty that teach sociology courses are obviously oblivious when it comes to the technological elements required for students to succeed in the corporate and research world.

I am currently working toward an MS in Environmental Management at UHCL.


The Clinical Psychology program has a great reputation in the community and does an excellent job of preparing counselors.

I am so happy I chose psychology. My only other wish would have been to proceed into another sub-category, such as Family and Marriage Counseling, however that was not an option at that time in my life.


I love history. I would eventually like to get my PhD.
