

# What's new in the Office of Research and Sponsored Programs (ORSP)?

## **Internal Submission of Grant Applications**

As per our new Interim Policy, faculty are required to notify ORSP, their Department Chair, and Dean at least 30 business days ahead of the grant deadline that they intend to apply. Reach out to your Department Chair and Dean via email and use our new Intent to Apply for External Funding form to notify ORSP. We need your grant application materials at least 10 business days before the deadline for review.

### **Financial Management of Grant Funds**

All grant-funded transactions must be routed via OCG in PeopleSoft for approval before purchasing. If you are hiring with grant funds, you need to notate the grant cost center in the comments on your Human Resources (i.e. ePAR) forms; otherwise, your request may be denied.

## Financial Conflict of Interest Disclosures (formerly called Conflict of Interest)

We are introducing a new form to comply with the Chips & Science Act of 2022 and University of Houston System (UHS) <u>SAM Policy 01.G.03</u>. Investigators who have been identified as having a current grant-funded project or a pending/upcoming proposal will receive the new Qualtrics form via email on September 1. Faculty applying for grants throughout the fiscal year will be asked to complete the form on an as-needed basis. The form can be accessed from our <u>Conflict of Interest webpage</u>.

## **Foreign Talent Recruitment Program Disclosures**

Also in line with the Chips & Science Act, UHS has introduced <u>SAM Policy 01.G.04</u> - Participation in Foreign Talent Recruitment Programs. Faculty applying for federal funds will be required to sign an acknowledgement of this policy, which can be found <u>on our website</u>. If you have a foreign interest to disclose as per this SAM, use the form for Financial Conflict of Interest to document this disclosure. What do we mean by foreign interest? ### Cayuse IRB

As of September 1, IRB applications (approval for human subjects research) will only be accepted via Cayuse. We have developed a <u>short training module</u> that walks you through the basics. #### **SMART IRB**

UHCL is now part of SMART IRB, a platform that facilitates IRB reliance agreements (also called IRB Authorization Agreement, IAA, single IRB, or sIRB). If you are working with colleagues at another institution on a human subjects research project, you will need to initiate the agreement process in SMART IRB.
