### Transfer Guide Notes

\* College Algebra is recommended for students seeking the 4–8 Teacher Certification since it is the pre-requisite for Math for Teachers I & II.

\*\* The 4–8 Teacher Certification requires 14 hours of Science (two 4 hour and two 3 hour courses), one course in each of the following is recommended: BIOL/ENSC, GEOL, and ASTR/CHEM/PHYS

\*\*\*Public Speaking is recommended for future teachers since it is part of the Teacher Education Program requirements. However, any extra Texas Core classes completed may end up satisfying these—check with a [UHCL Transfer Advisor](#) prior to enrolling in any Component Area Option 090 courses.

### Transfer Credit Limit

UHCL will accept up to **66 hours** for the transfer courses listed above toward this degree's requirements. Students may transfer to UHCL at any point, the courses listed above are only provided for those who are attempting to maximize course options at their current community college prior to transferring.
