We developed our program curriculum with input from industry, government, consulting and nonprofit organizations, ensuring that you receive the broad-based comprehensive environmental knowledge, skills, and topical insight you need to excel in your career. Since its inception in 1974, our Environmental Management program has become one of the most respected in the nation, with hundreds of our alumni holding leadership positions.

Our flexible curriculum meets the needs of full-time students as well as practicing professionals. Students can tailor the degree to their professional needs by selecting electives such as water management, environmental risk management, permits and procedures, sustainability, coastal resilience, oil and hazardous materials spills, and more. Students also have the opportunity to take electives in other fields such as geographical information systems, toxicology, industrial hygiene and environmental geology.

As much as 80% or as little as 20% of the courses may be taken online. Non-online courses typically meet 7 to 10 p.m. one evening per week, and most are hybrid, such that online material substitutes for two to five of the class sessions.
