Packing Checklist

- 1. Passport
- 2. Original I-20
- 3. Acceptance letter from the University
- 4. Supporting financial documents such as bank statements, awarded scholarship documents, etc.
- 5. Always have the name and contact information of the person you will be staying with and the Designated School Official as listed on your I-20. You should also keep the campus police phone number with you for an emergency situation. They can be contacted 24/7 by calling 1-281-283-2222.

1 Orientation – Sign up for <u>New Student Orientation</u>

2 Transcripts

Send final transcripts & test scores to the Office of International Admissions and Programs.

3 E-Services

You received a Student ID number that serves as your login for your E-Service portal. Keep Track of your progress, documents, and tuition payments.

4 Hawk Card (after you arrive at UHCL)

Your Hawk Card will be the most important piece of student identification on campus. You can print documents, buy food, and attend campus events.

5 Bacterial Meningitis Vaccine

Get your Bacterial Meningitis vaccine (Under 22 years of age), at least 10 days before the first day of class. Without the vaccine you will not be able to register for classes.

6 Register for Classes in <u>E-Services</u>

7 Housing

There are plenty of benefits to living on campus, including, being within walking distance to class, campus events, saving money on gas, and food.



Information technology is a driving force for Houston business. Houston is home to more than 400 software development companies. Nine companies of the 2010 Deloitte Technology Fast 500 list have their headquarters in Houston.

TRAINING IN HOUSTON

Work authorization off-campus can be granted for internships, cooperative education opportunities or practicum. Work authorization off-campus can also be granted for Optical Practical Training (OPT). This temporary employment can provide you with work experience directly related to your area of study. Most students qualify for 12 months of OPT; some students in the science, technology, engineering, and mathematics fields can qualify for 17 additional months of work authorization. ON-CAMPUS JOBS

Many departments on-campus offer employment opportunities for students. Possible tasks range from clerical and reception work to assisting professors with grading or the development of course materials. Teaching and research assistant positions are also available. In addition to receiving an hourly wage, assistantships can qualify students for in-state tuition and fees. These positions typically are available to students who have been enrolled for at least two semesters. We recommend you begin your job search in the Career and Counseling Office. They will have a listing of all available jobs on campus.
