- Assign To feature empowers instructors to personalize availability periods for specific learners.
- **Moderate This Quiz feature** enables instructors to specify different time limits for different learners.

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Differentiated Assignments

- Use the **Assign To feature** in areas in addition to quizzes.
- Differ assignments by section, groups, or individuals.
- Example: If you typically merge an undergraduate and graduate section into a single Canvas shell and want to have different versions of exams, papers, discussions, etc., for students depending on their section.

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Audio/Video Feedback in SpeedGrader

Canvas' Speedgrader enables instructors to record personalized audio/video feedback to students with their grades.





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Assignment Tab – Key to Your Gradebook!

- To access, review, and grade student submissions and exams, the Canvas Gradebook is the place to go. However, if you want to set up grading categories and weighted grading to compute course grades, you must start in the Canvas Assignments tab.
- The Discussion tab contains only discussions, and the Quizzes tab contains only tests and quizzes. However, anything graded in a Canvas shell (including graded discussions and quizzes) are listed within the Assignments tab.





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Groups and Weighting in Assignments

Confusing Vocabulary Alert! Assignment "Groups"

- 1. Determine the names for each category ("Group") you want to create.
- 2. Use the "+Group" button in Assignments to create and save each category.
- 3. Move assignments, quizzes, discussions, etc. to their respective categories.
- 4. Edit each category to apply final grade weighting and and dropped items.

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Canvas–Zoom Integration Overview

Use the Zoom "you know and love" from within your Canvas shell for virtual lectures, online class presentations, and student appointment scheduling!

- 1. Enable the Zoom LTI 1.3 link on your Canvas course menu.
- 2. Click the Zoom LTI 1.3 link to access your UHCL Zoom account.
- 3. From the Zoom Home tab, schedule any virtual class sessions, meetings, etc.
- 4. From the Zoom Appointments tab, set up a recurring appointment schedule to let students schedule one-on-one Zoom calls with you.



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Bonus Preview! Discussion Checkpoints

- Going live before SU25 is a new feature tailor-made by Instructure for those of us who have two deadlines for our online discussions – one for students' initial posts and a second for them to submit their peer reviews/replies.
- The new feature enables instructors to post partial grades for each component if they want to do so.
- More importantly, using the new feature will populate BOTH discussion due dates to their Canvas calendar, reminding them of the split deadlines.
