Please know that this latter type of behavior is not only inappropriate, but will not be tolerated at UHCL. The safety and security of our students, faculty, staff and visitors is always a very high priority.

If anyone feels harassed or threatened at any time while at UHCL, I encourage you to report the incident. The University of Houston System <u>Discrimination and Harassment Policy</u> defines and describes prohibited discrimination and harassment and provides a mechanism for processing complaints of unlawful discrimination and harassment against all faculty, staff, students and visitors.
