Navy Industrial Hygiene Officers (IHOs) are tasked with supporting the health and safety of service members by recognition, evaluation, and control of hazards in Shore, Field and Deployed environments.

- Provide direction worldwide to the Department of the Navy (DON) Environmental and Occupational Health,
 Industrial Hygiene, and Safety programs
- Serve as advisors for environmental and occupational health issues to reduce injury and disease risks among Navy and Marine Corps personnel, both afloat and ashore
- Lead large multidisciplinary departments and directorates such as Occupational Health and Preventive Medicine, fill critical staff positions at higher headquarters commands, and provide technical expertise at research facilities and laboratories
- Conduct inspections and training functions in industrial or operational settings aboard ships, at shore-based workplaces or in the field with Navy Sailors and Marines

- Certification American Board of Industrial Hygiene (ABIH) is preferred.
