Mirrors, validates and empathizes.

Check for understanding: paraphrase what teller has said.	
"Did I get the essence of your comments"?	
If the student believes both retellers understand their challenge, first the faculty then the Writing Center tutor query the teller / student	
Example: Listener / Reteller #1 (faculty)	
"I heard you say that you did not understand my explanation of the LR and TF. Would it be helpful if I conducted a short review and give the class an opportunity to form outside study groups?"	

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Example: Listener / Reteller #2 (Writing Center tutor)

"I heard that your visit to the WC was less than favorable. Would it be helpful to partner you with a tutor who is working with doctoral students?"
