Citation Machine

Zotero

Zotero is a free, open-source document sorting software that will also create a bibliography and in-text citations. There are extensions for Word and Google Docs as well as “connectors” to save articles to the software from any browser. Zotero is great for large-scale research projects with many references. Contact the UHCL research librarians for assistance setting up and using Zotero.

Google Scholar

Google scholar is a user-friendly search engine for scholarly articles and case law. It is a good resource if you are having trouble using the UHCL library databases; however, it does not have an advance search function to narrow down your choices like the databases.

Grammarly

Grammarly is a grammar, spelling, and plagiarism checking software. It offers free and paid service levels.

NOTE: Grammarly may give incorrect or unnecessary suggestions. If you are unsure whether Grammarly's suggestions are useful for your essay, consult with a writing tutor.

GrammarBook

GrammarBook is a comprehensive website that explains grammar and punctuation rules. It also offers quizzes and the option to order the print version of the GrammarBook.

OneLook Thesaurus

The OneLook reverse dictionary will take any word or phrase and find close matches. Unlike other online thesauruses, OneLook works well with phrases, so if you forget the word for “not on purpose” you can type it in and the first result will be “accidental.”
